

This Month's Q&A

Q: What Financial Support is available for my business?

Government has many grants and loans available to subsidise and help with loss of revenues. <u>Canada's COVID-19 Economic</u>
<u>Response Plan - Canada.ca</u>

The Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) provides interest-free, partially forgivable, loans of up to \$60,000, to small businesses and not-for-profits, that have experienced diminished revenues due to COVID-19 but face ongoing non-deferrable costs, such as rent, utilities, insurance, taxes and wages.

We have recently expanded CEBA to include an additional interest-free \$20,000 loan, 50% of which would be forgivable if repaid by December 31, 2022. This means the additional loan effectively increases CEBA loans from the existing \$40,000 to \$60,000 for eligible businesses, of which a total of \$20,000 will be forgiven if the balance of the loan is repaid by December 31 2022. Business owners can apply through their Bank until

June 30, 2021
