The Calypso Foundation is a non-profit organization that provides employment and training to adults who have intellectual disabilities.

HMS Calypso was a corvette of the Royal Navy and the name ship of her class. Built for distant cruising in the heyday of the British Empire, she served as a warship and training vessel until 1922. when she was sold. Calypso had a quiet career, consisting mainly of training cruises in the Atlantic Ocean. In 1902 she was sent to the colony of Newfoundland, where she served as a training vessel for the Newfoundland Royal Naval Reserve before and during the First World War. In 1922 she was declared surplus and sold, then used as a storage hull

# What options are available to help with my debt that I can trust?

They are legally and ethically bound to provide accurate, unbiased debt advice and they are subject to reviews and audits to ensure adherence to standards of practice.




